The FIRST LESSON is read 2 Kings 22: 15 – 23: 3

And she said unto them, Thus saith the Lord God of Israel,
Tell the man that sent you to me, Thus saith the Lord,
Behold, I will bring evil upon this place, and upon the
inhabitants thereof, even all the words of the book which
the king of Judah hath read: Because they have forsaken
me, and have burned incense unto other gods, that they
might provoke me to anger with all the works of their
hands; therefore my wrath shall be kindled against this
place, and shall not be quenched. But to the king of Judah
which sent you to enquire of the Lord, thus shall ye say to
him, Thus saith the Lord God of Israel, As touching the

words which thou hast heard; Because thine heart was
tender, and thou hast humbled thyself before the Lord,
when thou heardest what I spake against this place, and
against the inhabitants thereof, that they should become a
desolation and a curse, and hast rent thy clothes, and wept
before me; I also have heard thee, saith the Lord. Behold
therefore, I will gather thee unto thy fathers, and thou shalt
be gathered into thy grave in peace; and thine eyes shall not
see all the evil which I will bring upon this place. And they
brought the king word again.

And the king sent, and they gathered unto him all the elders
of Judah and of Jerusalem. And the king went up into the
house of the Lord, and all the men of Judah and all the
inhabitants of Jerusalem with him, and the priests, and the
prophets, and all the people, both small and great: and he
read in their ears all the words of the book of the covenant
which was found in the house of the Lord. And the king stood
by a pillar, and made a covenant before the Lord, to walk
after the Lord, and to keep his commandments and his
testimonies and his statutes with all their heart and all their
soul, to perform the words of this covenant that were written
in this book. And all the people stood to the covenant.

1 Timothy 2

I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers,
intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men;
For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may
lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty.
For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our
Saviour; Who will have all men to be saved, and to come
unto the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God, and
one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus;
Who gave himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due
time. Whereunto I am ordained a preacher, and an apostle,
(I speak the truth in Christ, and lie not;) a teacher of the
Gentiles in faith and verity. I will therefore that men pray
every where, lifting up holy hands, without wrath and
doubting. In like manner also, that women adorn themselves
in modest apparel, with shamefacedness and sobriety;
not with broided hair, or gold, or pearls, or costly array;
But (which becometh women professing godliness) with
good works. Let the woman learn in silence with all subjection.
But I suffer not a woman to teach, nor to usurp authority
over the man, but to be in silence. For Adam was first formed,
then Eve. And Adam was not deceived, but the woman being
deceived was in the transgression. Notwithstanding she shall
be saved in childbearing, if they continue in faith and charity
and holiness with sobriety.
