They said moreover unto Pharaoh, For to sojourn in the  
land are we come; for thy servants have no pasture for

now therefore, we pray thee, let thy servants dwell in  
the land of Goshen. And Pharaoh spake unto Joseph,  
saying, Thy father and thy brethren are come unto  
thee: The land of Egypt is before thee; in the best of the  
land make thy father and brethren to dwell; in the land  
of Goshen let them dwell: and if thou knowest any men  
of activity among them, then make them rulers over  
my cattle. And Joseph brought in Jacob his father, and  
set him before Pharaoh: and Jacob blessed Pharaoh.  
And Pharaoh said unto Jacob, How old art thou? And  
Jacob said unto Pharaoh, The days of the years of my  
pilgrimage are an hundred and thirty years: few and  
evil have the days of the years of my life been, and  
have not attained unto the days of the years of the life  
of my fathers in the days of their pilgrimage. And Jacob  
blessed Pharaoh, and went out from before Pharaoh.  
And Joseph placed his father and his brethren, and  
gave them a possession in the land of Egypt, in the best  
of the land, in the land of Rameses, as Pharaoh had  
commanded. And Joseph nourished his father, and his  
brethren, and all his father's household, with bread,  
according to their families.
