The FIRST LESSON is read

Isaiah 52: 1–10

Awake, awake; put on thy strength, O Zion; put on
thy beautiful garments, O Jerusalem, the holy city:
for henceforth there shall no more come into thee the
uncircumcised and the unclean. Shake thyself from
the dust; arise, and sit down, O Jerusalem: loose thyself
from the bands of thy neck, O captive daughter of Zion.
For thus saith the Lord, Ye have sold yourselves for
nought; and ye shall be redeemed without money.
For thus saith the Lord God, My people went down
aforetime into Egypt to sojourn there; and the Assyrian
oppressed them without cause. Now therefore, what
have I here, saith the Lord, that my people is taken
away for nought? they that rule over them make them
to howl, saith the Lord; and my name continually every
day is blasphemed. Therefore my people shall know

my name: therefore they shall know in that day that
I am he that doth speak: behold, it is I. How beautiful
upon the mountains are the feet of him that bringeth
good tidings, that publisheth peace; that bringeth good
tidings of good, that publisheth salvation; that saith
unto Zion, Thy God reigneth! Thy watchmen shall lift
up the voice; with the voice together shall they sing:
for they shall see eye to eye, when the Lord shall bring
again Zion. Break forth into joy, sing together, ye waste
places of Jerusalem: for the Lord hath comforted his
people, he hath redeemed Jerusalem. The Lord hath made
bare his holy arm in the eyes of all the nations; and all
the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.

Romans 10: 5–end

For Moses describeth the righteousness which is of
the law, That the man which doeth those things shall
live by them. But the righteousness which is of faith
speaketh on this wise, Say not in thine heart, Who shall
ascend into heaven? (that is, to bring Christ down from
above:) Or, Who shall descend into the deep? (that is,
to bring up Christ again from the dead.) But what
saith it? The word is nigh thee, even in thy mouth, and
in thy heart: that is, the word of faith, which we preach;
That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus,
and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him
from the dead, thou shalt be saved. For with the heart
man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth
confession is made unto salvation. For the scripture
saith, Whosoever believeth on him shall not be ashamed.
For there is no difference between the Jew and the Greek:
for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon
him. For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord
shall be saved. How then shall they call on him in whom
they have not believed? and how shall they believe in
him of whom they have not heard? and how shall they
hear without a preacher? And how shall they preach,
except they be sent? as it is written, How beautiful are
the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace, and
bring glad tidings of good things! But they have not
all obeyed the gospel. For Esaias saith, Lord, who hath
believed our report? So then faith cometh by hearing,
and hearing by the word of God. But I say, Have they not
heard? Yes verily, their sound went into all the earth,
and their words unto the ends of the world. But I say,
Did not Israel know? First Moses saith, I will provoke
you to jealousy by them that are no people, and by a
foolish nation I will anger you. But Esaias is very bold,
and saith, I was found of them that sought me not; I was
made manifest unto them that asked not after me. But
to Israel he saith, All day long I have stretched forth
my hands unto a disobedient and gainsaying people.
