The FIRST LESSON is read Job 31: 13–23

If I did despise the cause of my manservant or of my
maidservant, when they contended with me; What then
shall I do when God riseth up? and when he visiteth,
what shall I answer him? Did not he that made me in
the womb make him? and did not one fashion us in the
womb? If I have withheld the poor from their desire, or
have caused the eyes of the widow to fail; Or have eaten
my morsel myself alone, and the fatherless hath not
eaten thereof; (For from my youth he was brought up
with me, as with a father, and I have guided her from

my mother's womb;) If I have seen any perish for want
of clothing, or any poor without covering; If his loins
have not blessed me, and if he were not warmed with
the fleece of my sheep; If I have lifted up my hand
against the fatherless, when I saw my help in the gate:
Then let mine arm fall from my shoulder blade, and
mine arm be broken from the bone. For destruction
from God was a terror to me, and by reason of his
highness I could not endure.

All sit for the SECOND LESSON Matthew 7: 1–12

Judge not, that ye be not judged. For with what judgment
ye judge, ye shall be judged: and with what measure ye
mete, it shall be measured to you again. And why beholdest
thou the mote that is in thy brother's eye, but considerest
not the beam that is in thine own eye? Or how wilt thou
say to thy brother, Let me pull out the mote out of thine
eye; and, behold, a beam is in thine own eye? Thou
hypocrite, first cast out the beam out of thine own eye;
and then shalt thou see clearly to cast out the mote out
of thy brother's eye. Give not that which is holy unto the
dogs, neither cast ye your pearls before swine, lest they
trample them under their feet, and turn again and rend
you. Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall
find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you: For every
one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth;
and to him that knocketh it shall be opened. Or what
man is there of you, whom if his son ask bread, will he
give him a stone? Or if he ask a fish, will he give him a
serpent? If ye then, being evil, know how to give good
gifts unto your children, how much more shall your
Father which is in heaven give good things to them that
ask him? Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that
men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is
the law and the prophets.
