The FIRST LESSON is read Proverbs 22: 17-end

Bow down thine ear, and hear the words of the wise,
and apply thine heart unto my knowledge. For it is a
pleasant thing if thou keep them within thee; they shall
withal be fitted in thy lips. That thy trust may be in the
Lord, I have made known to thee this day, even to thee.
Have not I written to thee excellent things in counsels
and knowledge, That I might make thee know the
certainty of the words of truth; that thou mightest
answer the words of truth to them that send unto thee?
Rob not the poor, because he is poor: neither oppress
the afflicted in the gate: For the Lord will plead their
cause, and spoil the soul of those that spoiled them.

furious man thou shalt not go: Lest thou learn his ways,
and get a snare to thy soul. Be not thou one of them
that strike hands, or of them that are sureties for debts.
If thou hast nothing to pay, why should he take away

diligent in his business? he shall stand before kings;
he shall not stand before mean men.

It is not expedient for me doubtless to glory. I will
come to visions and revelations of the Lord. I knew a
man in Christ above fourteen years ago, (whether in
the body, I cannot tell; or whether out of the body,
I cannot tell: God knoweth;) such an one caught up to
the third heaven. And I knew such a man, (whether in
the body, or out of the body, I cannot tell: God knoweth;)
How that he was caught up into paradise, and heard
unspeakable words, which it is not lawful for a man
to utter. Of such an one will I glory: yet of myself I
will not glory, but in mine infirmities. For though I
would desire to glory, I shall not be a fool; for I will
say the truth: but now I forbear, lest any man should
think of me above that which he seeth me to be, or
that he heareth of me. And lest I should be exalted
above measure through the abundance of the revelations,
there was given to me a thorn in the flesh, the messenger
of Satan to buffet me, lest I should be exalted above
measure. For this thing I besought the Lord thrice,
that it might depart from me. And he said unto me,
My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made
perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather
glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may
rest upon me. Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities,
in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in
distresses for Christ's sake: for when I am weak, then
am I strong.
