Eat and drink in remembrance that he died for you,
and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

The clergy, servers and choir receive communion, after which all are welcome to come forward. Those who are baptized and receive communion in their own churches are welcome to receive communion here. Those who do not receive communion are welcome to come forward for a blessing.

The choir sings

*Deliver me, Lord, from everlasting death on that dreadful day,
when the heavens and the earth shall be moved, and thou shall
come to judge the world by fire. I quake with fear and tremble,
awaiting the day of judgement and the wrath to come, when
the heavens and the earth shall be moved. That day, the day of
wrath, of calamity and misery, that day, the great and most
bitter day, when you will come to judge our age with fire. Grant
them eternal rest, O Lord, and may everlasting light shine on
them. Deliver me ...*
