The FIRST LESSON is read Proverbs 27: 11–end

My son, be wise, and make my heart glad, that I may
answer him that reproacheth me. A prudent man foreseeth
the evil, and hideth himself; but the simple pass on, and
are punished. Take his garment that is surety for a stranger,
and take a pledge of him for a strange woman. He that

blesseth his friend with a loud voice, rising early in the
morning, it shall be counted a curse to him. A continual
dropping in a very rainy day and a contentious woman
are alike. Whosoever hideth her hideth the wind, and the
ointment of his right hand, which bewrayeth itself. Iron
sharpeneth iron; so a man sharpeneth the countenance
of his friend. Whoso keepeth the fig tree shall eat the
fruit thereof: so he that waiteth on his master shall be
honoured. As in water face answereth to face, so the heart
of man

to man. Hell and destruction are never full; so the eyes
of man are never satisfied. As the fining pot for silver,
and the furnace for gold; so is a man to his praise.
Though thou shouldest bray a fool in a mortar among
wheat with a pestle, yet will not his foolishness depart
from him. Be thou diligent to know the state of thy flocks,
and look well to thy herds. For riches are not for ever:
and doth the crown endure to every generation? The hay
appeareth, and the tender grass sheweth itself, and herbs
of the mountains are gathered. The lambs are for thy
clothing, and the goats are the price of the field. And thou
shalt have goats' milk enough for thy food, for the food
of thy household, and for the maintenance for thy
maidens.

Brethren, if a man be overtaken in a fault, ye which are
spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meekness;
considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted. Bear ye
one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ.
For if a man think himself to be something, when he is
nothing, he deceiveth himself. But let every man prove
his own work, and then shall he have rejoicing in himself
alone, and not in another. For every man shall bear his own
burden. Let him that is taught in the word communicate
unto him that teacheth in all good things. Be not deceived;
God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that
shall he also reap. For he that soweth to his flesh shall of
the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the Spirit
shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting. And let us not be
weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if
we faint not. As we have therefore opportunity, let us do
good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the
household of faith.
