THE SACRIFICE OF THE MANY

Over the five years of The Great War, military khaki took the place of academic dress as the student population fell and the Colleges hosted officers in training, military conferences and wounded soldiers. At night, lights were extinguished in order to avert zeppelin attacks, leaving the streets utterly dark. We explore the personal impact World War I had on the College through the story of Henry Montagu Butler, Master of Trinity 1886–1918. All three of Butler's sons fought in the war but only two of them returned safely to their father. Gordon Montagu Butler died in service in 1916 and his is one of the 619 names inscribed on the war memorial.

The War of to-day, with its many horrors, its crushing griefs, its lavish but ungrudged sacrifices, its splendid courage ... will be one of the great sign-posts in the long tale of our country's struggles; one of those epochs in which, with a full, a chastened, and a united heart, our people thanked God and took courage.

[The hospital] has been a house of mercy to young men, not students ... but young men stricken down for the time by no fault of their own but by wounds or accidents, some of them wounded in the fierce battles ... where they saw so many of their officers and their comrades destroyed in a moment by the German shells; some of them almost envying these brave companions because they were themselves for some weeks prevented from going to the front and forced to remain in our peaceful England.

If you return home safely while your old father is living, it will be truly the crowning joy of his long life.

How can I write about this dear dear most loveable Boy! Little did I dream when I wrote to you yesterday the second part of my Birthday letter that he was no longer with you – no longer to be seen and talked with and laughed with, though, thank God, he lives even more than ever, never to be absent from our memories, our hearts, our intense love ... I love to think, to be sure, that you [and Gordon and Neville] will all meet again. Such a threefold cord is not quickly or *ever* broken.

THE SACRIFICE OF THE ONE

But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died. For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human being; for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ.

1 Corinthians 15: 12-14

On the cross, Jesus was a victim of violence and made an offering of his life that all may know God's peace. At the foot of his cross, we join our prayers with his, and give thanks for his sacrifice that was made once for all. We hear how Jesus' own life and death reveal a glimpse of God's Kingdom, where war, death and suffering are overcome by God's life and love.

From noon on, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. And about three o'clock Jesus cried with a loud voice, "Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?" that is, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" When some of the bystanders heard it, they said, "This man is calling for Elijah." At once one of them ran and got a sponge, filled it with sour wine, put it on a stick, and gave it to him to drink. But the others said, "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to save him." Then Jesus cried again with a loud voice and breathed his last. At that moment the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. The earth shook, and the rocks were split. The tombs also were opened, and many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised. After his resurrection they came out of the tombs and entered the holy city and appeared to many. Now when the centurion and those with him, who were keeping watch over Jesus, saw the earthquake and what took place, they were terrified and said, "Truly this man was God's Son!"

As they were looking on, so we too gaze on his wounds as he hangs. We see his blood as he dies. We see the price offered by the redeemer, touch the scars of his resurrection. He bows his head, as if to kiss you. His heart is made bare open, as it were, in love to you. His arms are extended that he may embrace you. His whole body is displayed for your redemption. Ponder how great these things are. Let all this be rightly weighed in your mind: as he was once fixed to the cross in every part of his body for you, so he may now be fixed in every part of your soul.

SACRIFICE AND THE SAINTS

Saints are people that the Church recognises as leading lives of exceptional holiness. In 1962 Vatican II declared saints to be the means that 'God shows to men, in a vivid way, His presence and His face ... He speaks to us in them and offers us a sign of this kingdom to which we are powerfully attracted, so great a cloud of witnesses is there given and such a witness to the truth of the Gospel. It is not merely by the title of example that we cherish the memory of those in heaven; we seek rather that by this devotion to the exercise of fraternal charity the union of the whole Church in the Spirit may be strengthened.'

Lumen Gentium No. 50

We examine the life of Oscar Romero, the Church's most recently canonised Saint, and we explore how his faith gave him meaning and hope in even his darkest moments. Oscar Romero believed that the love of God could overcome all suffering and evil, and in this centenary year, that is the hope to which we too cling:

Though we see that waves of violence succeed in drowning the fire of Christian love, love must win out; it is the only thing that can.

See, I have set before you today life and prosperity, death and adversity. If you obey the commandments of the Lord your God that I am commanding you today, by loving the Lord your God, walking in his ways, and observing his commandments, decrees, and ordinances, then you shall live and become numerous, and the Lord your God will bless you in the land that you are entering to possess. But if your heart turns away and you do not hear, but are led astray to bow down to other gods and serve them, I declare to you today that you shall perish; you shall not live long in the land that you are crossing the Jordan to enter and possess. I call heaven and earth to witness against you today that I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Choose life so that you and your descendants may live, loving the Lord your God, obeying him, and holding fast to him; for that means life to you and length of days, so that you may live in the land that the Lord swore to give to your ancestors, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob.

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. Those who believe in him are not condemned; but those who do not believe are condemned already, because they have not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the judgement, that the light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil. For all who do evil hate the light and do not come to the light, so that their deeds may not be exposed. But those who do what is true come to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that their deeds have been done in God.
